November 2018 CCVPD Highlights

Crime/Operational

- 1. Village Police have identified an area-wide trend of daytime thefts from vehicles. One event occurred on the middle block of Grafton Street on the afternoon of November 7; another occurred in the 3900 block of Oliver on 11/9; two other thefts occurred in the afternoon on 11/25—one in the 6100 block of Western Avenue and the other on the middle block of Grafton; DC police have seen this same trend. Village Police have been exchanging information with DC and Montgomery County investigators.
 - 11/7 daytime theft from construction vans on Grafton: An eyewitness observed a car occupied by 4 young males stop on Grafton near Cedar Parkway. Two of the car's occupants got out and smashed the window of a work van, entered it and stole a wallet containing \$700. The suspects then entered another work van nearby (this one was unlocked) and stole a second wallet containing \$50. The suspects spotted the eyewitness and drove off as she called the police. Investigation revealed that the suspect's car had been stolen in DC. DC had several similar thefts with this same car in the lookout.
 - 11/9 daytime theft from landscape truck on Oliver: While the crew worked in a nearby yard, unknown thieves stole 3 backpacks from the open truck. 3 smart phones, sunglasses and other items were among the stolen items within the backpacks.
 - 11/25 daytime theft from construction truck on Western Ave: Contractor reported that someone reached through the open window of his truck and stole a backpack containing multiple items including his wallet with cash and ID. Victim said he had left his truck for only 3 minutes.
 - 11/25 daytime theft from car on Grafton: Resident reported this event 3 days after it occurred. He reported that, between 1pm and 5pm, someone stole a Samsung smart phone and an Apple tablet from their unlocked car parked in the driveway
- **2.** Several unlocked cars were entered on Grafton Street overnight on November 19. Nothing taken from most of them; sunglasses, garage door openers, coins and a tool taken from two cars.
- **3. Bicycle taken from open garage on Oliver Street:** Resident from the 3900 block of Oliver Street reported that his bicycle valued at \$900 was taken from his open garage between 11/14 and 11/21.

Administrative/Training

- On 11/15, Sgt. Tiedemann, Lt. Dasilva and Chief Fitzgerald attended Implicit Bias training sponsored by LGIT (our insurer) and presented by a sociology professor from the University of Maryland. We plan to cycle all sworn officers through this training.
- Chief Fitzgerald participated in the second 'Over-the-Edge' rappelling fundraiser for the Maryland Special Olympics on 11/3.




