I. Crime/Operational

Package theft: On November 18 at 10:36 a.m. In the 100 block of Primrose Street, a resident's doorbell camera recorded a man take a package from her porch. The package contained \$8.50 of disposable diapers. The man was wearing a winter coat with a fur-lined hood.

2 unlocked vehicles entered—nothing taken: Overnight November 28-29, unknown person(s) entered the resident's unlocked cars parked in their driveway in the 6300 block of Broad Branch Road. Nothing was taken.

Apple Maps app glitches—and 'unglitches'—for a second time in 30 days: On November 22, we learned that the Apple Maps app was once again routing drivers onto Wisconsin from westbound Grafton in violation of the 'Do Not Enter' signs. We put out our custom signage and cones, we sent error messages through the app, and on November 25, Chief Fitzgerald sent a letter to Apple. The glitch disappeared by November 28. On December 3, Chief Fitzgerald received a phone call from an Apple Maps manager in response to the letter. We now have a personal contact with Apple Maps.

II. Administrative/Personnel

Holocaust Museum Tour:

One of our residents, Ms. Suzanne Resnick of Primrose Street, is a docent at the Holocaust Museum. She offered to lead a tour for some of our staff. Ms. Resnick ultimately led tours on 2 dates in November for a total of 8 police employees; we scheduled the employees in lieu of a work day. Our employees learned important lessons from the history of how the German police failed to protect individual liberties in a civil society.




